

Report from Nominating Committee LWVSFC  
April 18, 2023

The committee met four times during the period January-April 2023 to develop a slate of candidates for election at the Annual Meeting. Additionally, after interviewing members of the Leadership Team, the committee has formulated an additional recommendation for Board consideration.
